RE: Plant list for nearshore areas

Snohomish CD is proposing working with the Livingston Bay Community to enhance 6000 square feet of common area with native backshore vegetation to improve habitat and aesthetics. This planting will provide as an example to other landowners on what a healthy shoreline can look like. Snohomish CD will provide all plant material and the Livingston Bay Community members will, with guidance from Snohomish CD staff, remove weedy species and plant native groundcovers, shrubs and/or trees. The planting will consist of a band of vegetation averaging 15 feet wide along 400 linear feet of shore. The planting palette for this project is included in Table 1 and each landowner will have the ability to choose their preferred mix.


